Celebrate the 60th Flower Show!

2008 year celebrates the 60th staging of the Binfield Heath Flower Show at Holmwood. It first took place under this name in 1948, a revival of the pre-war Shiplake, Dunsden and Harpsden Flower Show established in 1882.

The Show proved popular in early years and expanded to include crafts such as knitting, sewing and cooking in addition to vegetables and flowers. New features were added including side shows, races and dancing. The Show has become an important annual event participated in and enjoyed by people from miles around.

Since 1948, the Binfield Heath Flower Show has been held in the village every year. Moving with the times, entry classes have been expanded to include new activities and interests while retaining its essential drive and enthusiasm.

The RHS Banksian Medal

The RHS Banksian Medal will be awarded to the entrant with the highest number of place points in the whole of the horticultural classes at the show. (This medal cannot be awarded to the same person for two years running.)

Rules and how to enter

All entries

Residents of the parishes of Binfield Heath, Eye & Dunsden, Harpsden and Shiplake are eligible to enter all classes. Everyone else may enter Open classes only.

Entries, on the form provided, should be delivered to Binfield Heath Village Stores or the Corner Shop, Lower Shiplake. Forms may be sent to Tony Furneaux, 39 Westleigh Drive, Sonning Common, RG4 9LA.

Entry forms must be in by 8.00pm on the Wednesday before the show. Late forms are not accepted.

All entries are free of charge.

Only one entry per exhibitor is allowed in each class.

Each exhibit must be the work of the exhibitor.

Each exhibitor will be allotted a number which will be placed on a card with his or her exhibits.

Exhibits must be in position in the show tent by 10.30am on Show Day.

Only judges and committee members may enter the tent during judging.

Prizes Unless otherwise stated will be: 1st prize £2; 2nd prize £1; 3rd prize 40p. 'Highly Commended' and 'Commended' may also be awarded and count in the points-based competitions for cups. Points in classes 1 and 174 will be 15-10-5. If there are fewer than three entries in a section 1st prize will not necessarily be awarded.

Cups are awarded on a points system: 1st prize, 10 points; 2nd prize, 5 points, 3rd prize, 2 points, Highly Commended 1/2 point, Commended 1/4 point. In the event of a tie, judges will look for exhibitors with the most 1st, 2nd or 3rd prizes to award the cup.

The Silver Jubilee Award is awarded to the family group winning the highest aggregate points in all sections. Five extra points are awarded for a three-generation entry. To calculate the winner, the total number of points won by each group will be divided by the number of people entering.

The Eye & Dunsden Challenge Cup will be awarded to the winner of most points in classes 13, 14, 15, 16.

Prize money not collected by 4.30pm on Show Day will be taken as a donation to Show funds.

Judges may withhold prizes if they consider the exhibits not worthy of winning or there are insufficient entries in a class.

Exhibits must be left in position until 4.30pm and should be removed before 5pm or they may be included in the auction of produce for show funds.

Objections should be in writing, signed by the objector and handed to the Show Secretary before 3.00pm.

Horticultural entries

Cut flowers must be presented in the standard vases which are supplied by the Committee.

Produce must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months before the Show.

Exhibitors' gardens and allotments must be open for inspection by members of the Committee after entries have been received.

Children's entries

Children must state on their entry forms the age they will be on Show Day.

Flower Show Top Tray Class

1st prize £10.00, 2nd prize £7.00, 3rd prize £3.00

The Flower Show Top Tray class is for a display of three types of vegetables from the following list of eight. The quantity of each required for the collection is given in brackets.

Carrots (3), cauliflowers (2), onions (3), parsnips (3), peas (6 pods), potatoes (3), runner beans (6 pods), tomatoes (6).

Each type of vegetable will be judged out of a total of 20 points. This is split into three sections: 7 points for size, shape and colour; 7 points for condition; 6 points for uniformity. The total marks will therefore be 60.

All vegetables are to be displayed for effect, within an area of 18" x 24" (45cm x 60cm). This can be a tray (measured area within lip) or a board or the area can simply be marked on the staging.

No part of any vegetable may be bent and no part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the display area.

A black cloth is allowed or the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing but no other foliage or accessories (eg plates, sand, rings). Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia.

Notes for judges and exhibitors

Carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 3". Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces (the green flower bud case).

Judges may handle exhibits and open pods to check quality. Any queries that may arise, concerning anything other than the rules above, should be referred to and decided by show officials. Failure to abide by any of these rules will lead to disqualification.
